Feed Fun With Purina Katie Nelson



As we wrap up my favorite season of the year, I hope you had a plentiful and safe harvest season! We have received some much needed moisture in the area and now we can hope for some snow this winter so we can continue to catch up going into next spring! Many of the pastures looked greener this fall then they did all year!

In the cow/calf world, many calves are weaned and sold or on feed and the cows are grazing stalks and on feed to gain back some condition before the heart of winter sets in. Please keep in mind that the #1 rule when feeding stock cows is that it is easier and much cheaper to put weight back on in the fall than it is over the cold months of winter and closer to calving. Most cows are coming off grass this fall stressed and in a lower BCS then we like to see. With hay production off this summer and feed prices being elevated, we should talk about options to keep your ration costs in check. Remember feeding Rumensin to the cowherd can improve feed efficiency and provide some cocci control as well! Having a year round mineral program will also set up for a calving season with higher calf vigor and higher colostrum quality!

As colder weather sets in this year, remember to provide adequate bedding and good quality water to your livestock! Please reach out if you would like to discuss anything or would like another set of eyes on your livestock! Good luck and have a safe hunting season and have a blessed rest of the year!
