Happy Harvest season! Here we are again! The crop is looking good out there! Just a couple reminders as we work through the harvest season:

We have storage and grain bank options available. 4 cents per bushel per month (storage has a 3 month minimum)

We can contract grain and defer pay until next year. Talk to myself or Adam for details.

Please remember, if you are bringing in grain to sell, let us know when you've brought the last load in and where we can send the check (or if you want to pick up here).

We appreciate your patience when you are delivering grain this fall...there will be a lot of traffic!!

Remember to stay safe as you begin harvest this season!

A Note From the Corner Office,

Happy Harvest Time from all of us at the Gilman Creamery! Gilman is excited for fall harvest!

As always, if you have any questions regarding your grain storage, accounts, etc. Please call! We are here to help!

What a beautiful start to fall! The crop has really started to come in! Please remember as you bring in grain to remember to let the staff know what crop you have, and what you are going to do with it, sell, contract, deferred pay, store, roasted or grain bank.

Sell: Selling crop at that days price

Contract: A price that has been previously contracted

Deferred Pay: Selling, but not getting paid until January 2023

Store: Storing of grain that can be priced to sell at a later time

Grain bank: Grain used for feed

Banked Roasted Beans: Beans that will be roasted for feed use

**When selling your crop remember the posted price is posted for the previous day. The prices are posted typically after 3pm each day for that day's crop! *subject to change at any time* Couple things for you all to think about in the combines as fall is here! Take a look at real margins for next year's crop! Fertilizer cost don't seem to be going down. Serious things to consider! I know that this is hard to think about. Please check with our sister company Mille Lacs Soil Service! They have great pre-season pricing! Please remember to stay safe this fall!

Silage With Katie Nelson

**Silage season is just about wrapped up and we are moving into earlage and HMC! Fall is here and I am hoping everyone has had a safe harvest season so far and continues to do so! This season, calf prices are the best we as producers have seen in quite some time, the cattle cycle is in our favor of selling higher priced cattle. Let's do everything we can to get a big healthy calf to weaning and then to market. Whether you wean and sell off the cow, background for any number of days or finish your cattle, we should be running a projection to get all the costs in front of you and know what we can do to improve your ROI. Creep feed this season is higher than we are used to, which is a higher out of pocket expense, but still has a ROI with increased calf prices. When creep feeding, it is always a good idea to keep track of intakes, as over eating can be expensive. Also, remember to continue to feed your fly control products for a little bit longer, the longer into the fall we can feed it, the cleaner our environment is in the spring once it starts to warm up.
