Feeding a milk replacer has many advantages over feeding whole milk to your calves. Some of these advantages are mitigating diseases passed through the milk to the calves, higher growth rates, additional vitamins and minerals, and products added for a healthy gut biome. I have personally seen these advantages as both a herd manager and as a nutritionist out in the field working with other herds.

Disease prevention is critical for the wellbeing of your calves. We want to reduce the amount of stress as much as we can on our calves, so that they can grow up to be the best versions of themselves that they can be. Some diseases that can be passed through the milk are Johne's, Bovine Tuberculosis, Salmonella, Clostridium, and possibly avian influenza. All of these can put your calves at risk of a weakened immune system, causing some serious setbacks or even death if not addressed in a timely manner. I have worked with a few producers who have struggled with some of these issues for many years, and by switching to a milk replacer, have controlled some of these potential risk factors.

Another benefit is consistency of the milk replacer can be less variable than feeding whole or waste milk to the calves. Most dairy producers see the swings in butter fat and protein throughout the year due to the weather conditions or a change in the feed being fed to the lactation cows. These changes can also cause some issues in our calves by either receiving too many solids when components are high or underfeeding when components drop. Also, different cows that are used to feed calves have varying levels of SCC and this can also cause some issues. Are these cows with high SCC inoculating the gut with some pathogens that could be causing the calves to scour? They could be.

There is still another option out there if you still want to utilize whole/pasturized milk and receive a lot of the same benefits as a milk replacer. Milk balancer is a product that can be used to fortify the whole milk. By adding a milk balancer, you can bring in more vitamins and minerals, add a coccidiostat, prebiotics/probiotics, and fly control. Milk is short on 7 different trace minerals for the requirements of calves, which a milk balancer can bring in. I have seen calves both on the dairy I managed and out in the field, over 10% heavier at weaning, just by adding the balancer. The most shocking result I saw was when these calves fed a balancer were part of the milking herd; they were producing 5-7 more pounds of milk per day than the same birth month cows that didn't receive the balancer.

If you are tired of hand mixing your milk replacer or doing small batches at a time, Purina is running a promotion on a milk replacer mixing vat right now.
